By and large, the procedure for mandatory continuing legal education (MCLE) accreditation is an extensive one, often requiring months of work. Every state with a MCLE requirement manages its own program with its own particular standards and controls. In this way, a CLE supplier looking for MCLE accreditation of its projects must apply to every state independently.

We have found it better for Individual lawyers to ask for accreditation from their specific states after the RCCS professional designation program has been completed by supplying regulators with a uniform application, course materials and a nominal fee. For convenience, here is a <u>Uniform Application</u>, courtesy of the Continuing Legal Education regulators Association.
